**Epiphany @ the NEW Samaritan Inn -
 March 3rd-7th**

It's that time of year again. Epiphany is called upon each year to provide a 6 person volunteer crews at the Samaritan Inn and Soup Kitchen. BIG change this year. They have moved next door in a BRAND NEW FACILITY (414 E NW Blvd)! Here is a quick version on what you can expect at the Inn:

They provide an exceptionally clean and safe environment for you to minister to others in need. You arrive at 6pm for orientation and help set up for dinner. As the guests arrive, you help serve the meals and assist in cleaning up. After dinner, you have the opportunity if you choose to hang out with the guests during down time in a common room for games and TV watching until participating in an incredibly powerful devotion in which you will hear stories of great faith and appreciation for life from men who are in a place that most of us will never go or even fathom. Lights out after devotion. Volunteers have a separate area to sleep and sometime during the night you will take a 2 hour shift at the desk with an Epiphany partner to watch the security monitor and bond with your fellow Lutheran. Help with serving breakfast at 6am and clean-up wraps up around 6:30am and you are on your way home or work.
